

New long-term care facility opens in St. Peter, MN



St. Peter, MN - The Benedictine Living Community of St. Peter (pictured above) in St. Peter, MN, is the state's newest long-term care facility. The first residents moved into the new building on

January 31, 2007. The building features 48 private rooms and 32 shared rooms. Residents live in neighborhoods of 10 residents that share a living and dining room and there is a private, fenced courtyard for every 20 residents to share. The new facility is attached to the St. Peter Community Hospital. On Saturday, March 31, 2007, Bishop John C. Neinstedt presided over the dedication and blessing of the new facility.
