Those Who Catechize
What Does It Say About the Pastor, the
Priest, the Seminarian?

is a great resource for parishes to understand the role of those who catechize: the pastor, the parish catechetical leader (PCL, formerly called the DRE or CRE), the parents, the catechists, and so on. I will take directly out of the NDC what it says about these various people and their role in catechizing and making

sure catechetical formation is effective in the parish, in the Area Faith Community:

Pastors have specific responsibilities that derive from their particular catechetical role. "All believers have a right to catechesis; all pastors have a duty to provide it" (Catechesi Tradendae, 64). Pastors are the bishops' closest collaborators in ensuring that the goals of the diocesan catechetical mission are achieved.

Attentive to the norms established by the diocesan bishop, the pastor is to take care in a special way:

- 1. That suitable catechesis is imparted for the celebration of the sacraments
- 2. That through catechetical instruction imparted for an appropriate period of time children and youth are prepared properly for the first reception of the

Sacraments of Penance and the Most Holy Eucharist and for the Sacrament of Confirmation

- That having received First Communion [and Confirmation], these children [and youth] are enriched more fully and deeply through catechetical formation
- That catechetical formation is given also to those who are physically or mentally impeded, insofar as their condition permits;
- 5. That the faith of youth and adults is strengthened, enlightened, and developed through various means and endeavors.

The pastor should also ensure that:

- Catechesis is emphasized in a way that provides ageappropriate opportunities for adults, youth, and children
- A total parish plan for catechesis is developed and implemented in consultation with the parish pastoral council and parish catechetical leadership
- Catechesis for adults of all ages is a priority adult formation should be provided in such a way that parishioners would recognize it as the parish's primary catechesis
- Catechesis for youth and young adults is situated within a comprehensive plan for youth ministry in the parish
- Catechists at all levels are well formed and trained for this task
- Catechesis is available for all language groups
- The baptismal catechumenate is a vital component in the organization of catechesis in the parish
- The catechumenate is an essential process in the parish, one that serves as the inspiration of all catechesis

Pastors should also work with parents, school, catechetical personnel, and appropriate boards and commissions in the parish to plan and carry out the catechetical mission in the local parish. The pastor has the primary responsibility to ensure that the catechetical needs, goals, and priorities of the parish are identified, articulated, and met. In parishes with no resident pastor, pastoral administrators have the same obligation.

These directives for the pastor can be helpful as the pastor along with his staff and really each parishioner

realize what needs to be done regarding the evangelizing and catechizing mission of the parish. The pastor as the lead catechist and shepherd of the parish needs to lead the way to ensure these directives do get done so that

everyone, from the pre-school student to the elderly adult, get the opportunity for catechetical formation. The NDC has some additional things to say about the priest in general, which includes the pastor, the parochial vicar, the senior associate, and the retired priest.

Priests share the teaching role of their bishops and are the immediate collaborators with them in the proclamation of the Gospel. The special role in the diocesan catechetical mission that they exercise arises directly from the Sacrament of Holy Orders, which constitutes priests as educators in the faith. Since a priest 'must be the catechist of catechists, forming... a veritable community of disciples of the Lord,' in his preaching and teaching and in the sacramental ministry of the Church, the priest transmits the Gospel of Christ, encourages conversion to him, fosters the life of faith and ongoing formation of faith, and inspires the prayer of the community of faith. They are leaders who offer support for all those involved in catechesis. In his parish, the priest has the responsibility of forming the Christian community and ensuring that the faithful are properly formed and reach true Christian maturity. Priests help to foster the ministry of catechists and assist them in carrying out their responsibilities by collaborating with catechetical leaders to provide catechists with formation and by supporting them, above all by their prayers. The parish priest plays an active role in the catechetical programs and is available to celebrate the sacraments with classes or groups. In addition, the Church expects priests "to neglect nothing with a view to a well-organized and well-oriented catechetical effort."

Parochial vicars, in giving support to a pastor's catechetical responsibilities, are especially called to:

- Foster a sense of common responsibility for catechesis in the parish and a recognition and appreciation for catechists and their mission
- Ensure that parish catechetical programs are systematic and complete
- Encourage those faithful who have the necessary qualities to be catechists among them
- Integrate catechesis with evangelization and foster the link between catechesis, sacraments, and Liturgy
- Ensure the connection between parish and diocesan catechetical efforts

Priests are absolutely essential contributors to an effective catechetical program. Their zealous leadership is essential to parish catechesis. In order to maintain and enrich their ministry as catechists, priests are to give

careful attention to their own catechetical formation and continue their education and spiritual formation after ordination.

In addition, it addresses seminarians and their learning about catechesis:

Frequently, candidates for the priesthood are being given catechetical responsibilities in the parishes in which they serve a pastoral internship. Seminarians need a clear understanding of the nature, goals, and methods of catechesis as well as the roles they will have in the catechetical programs of parishes and institutions to which they will be assigned as priests. They should learn the processes of human growth and development and faith formation so that they will be able to adapt the Gospel message to the age and ability of those they catechize. They should also have an understanding of the catechetical ministry of the Church and training in the organization and supervision of parish catechetical programs. They should be sensitive to the diversity of cultures, and those who are not native-born should have the opportunity to learn the culture of the United States.

Integrated throughout the NDC, there are other aspects that pastors and priests need to be aware of like home schooling and parish planning. Hopefully the NDC can shed some light on the importance of each of us, our role, and an appreciation for each of our roles to enhance the evangelizing and catechizing efforts of our parishes and AFCs.

Religious Education Safe Environment Compliance Reminders

All Catechist Lists from each parish were due Sept. 16. Please submit your catechist lists. If you do not have all the grades covered, send what you have and then continue to provide the names of new catechists as soon as possible. Please send Margy the lists: name, grade(s) taught, and e-mail address. (A form was sent to each parish to verify, change, delete, and/or add on. Thank you!

Any DRE, youth minister, catechist, adults helping with youth ministry, or anyone who may be in a ministry with minors is required to be in total compliance with safe environment requirements.

Some catechist lists received have included individuals who have not yet completed any diocesan Safe Environment requirements.

The four areas of compliance [a condition of employment or volunteer service] are:

- 1) Have a background check before beginning employment or volunteer service.
- Sign forms A & B of the 2007 diocesan sexual misconduct policy before beginning employment or volunteer service.
- 3) Attend a VIRTUS training session before beginning employment or volunteer service. If there is a serious reason that prevents attendance prior to employment or volunteer service, a grace period of 60 days is allowed, but this only pertains to long term ministries lasting a school or catechetical year.
- 4) Each individual is to complete online training as assigned.

Regarding the online training, it is to be completed within 30 days of being posted to the VIRTUS account. Communicate with your volunteers to complete the online training as soon as possible. It takes approximately 10 minutes (or less) to do the training and answer the questions at the end.

Do your Safe Environment training for children and youth during October or the first week of November at the latest. We need to do these at the beginning of the catechetical year rather than later to ensure our children and youth have the tools they need to be safe. Remember we are doing Lessons 1 and 2 this year. These reports are due back to the diocesan Safe Environment Office by November 11, 2014.

The Opt Out form with the information for parents are to be sent to the parents before the children's training. If parents wish to opt out they are to send the opt out form before the lesson takes place and they will then be given the age-appropriate lesson materials for their child(ren).

Remember to use only diocesan forms.


