The National Directory for Catechesis Those Who Catechize What Does It Say About the Catechetical Leader by Bryan Reising

The National Directory for Catechesis (NDC) is a great resource for parishes to understand the role of those who catechize: the pastor, the parish catechetical leader (PCL, formerly called the DRE or CRE), the parents, the catechists, and so on. I will take directly out of the NDC what it says about these various people and their role in catechizing and making sure catechetical formation is effective in the parish, in the Area Faith Community:

The single most critical factor in an effective parish catechetical program is the leadership of a professionally trained parish catechetical leader. Depending on the size and scope of the parish catechetical program, parishes should allocate their resources so that they are able to acquire the services of a competent and qualified catechetical leader (or someone who is in the process of becoming qualified and competent) or to share those services with another parish...Ordinarily, under the direction of the pastor, the main responsibilities of this position are as follows:

- Overall direction of the parish catechetical programs for adults, youth, and children
- Planning, implementation, and evaluation of the parish catechetical program
- Recruitment, formation, on-going development, and evaluation of catechists
- Implementation of diocesan and parish catechetical policies and guidelines, including the areas of catechist certification and supervision and administrative policies related to negligence, sexual abuse, sexual harassment,

- and the safety and protection of minors (USCCB Promise to Protect, Pledge to Heal, 2003)
- Collaboration with the pastor, other parish ministers, and appropriate committees, boards, and councils
- Assistance in liturgical planning
- Attention to his/her own personal, spiritual, and professional development

Dioceses and parishes should actively seek to identify potential parish catechetical leaders and, with the help of Catholic colleges and universities and organizations, provide them with opportunities to develop the competence and skills necessary for effective leadership and thorough knowledge of the faith. Only fully initiated, practicing Catholics who fully adhere to the Church's teaching in faith and morals and who are models of Christian virtue and courageous witnesses to the Catholic faith should be designated as parish catechetical leaders. Preparation for service as a parish catechetical leader should include advanced studies in theology, Scripture, Liturgy, catechesis and catechetical methodology, education psychology and theory, and administration, as well as practical catechetical experience with adults, youth, and children. A comprehensive knowledge of the General Directory for Catechesis and the Catechism of the Catholic Church is essential. In accord with diocesan policies, pastors who employ parish catechetical leaders should formulate a clear and specific agreement with them that lists the responsibilities of the position and elements of equitable compensation. Parish catechetical leaders should be full members of the parish pastoral staff and attend all its meetings.

The functions of such positions vary from parish to parish, but parish catechetical leaders are not simply administrators or general pastoral ministers. The need for systematic training and study should not be minimized. They are catechists first. They should continue their personal, spiritual, and professional development and participate in diocesan programs of in-service training and formation, catechetical institutes, conventions, retreats, and accredited programs.

Integrated throughout the NDC, there are other aspects that the parish catechetical leader needs to be aware of like what does it say about parents, catechists, and what does it say about catechetical formation for children, youth, and adults. This important document helps you to understand your role and the whole enterprise of evangelization and catechesis and helps you to better plan for the future.

Religious Education Safe Environment Compliance Reminders

All Catechist Lists from each parish were due Sept. 16. Please submit your catechist lists. If you do not have all the grades covered, send what you have and then continue to provide the names of new catechists as soon as possible. Please send Margy the lists: name, grade(s) taught, and e-mail address. (A form was sent to each parish to verify, change, delete, and/or add on. Thank you!

Any DRE, youth minister, catechist, adults helping with youth ministry, or anyone who may be in a ministry with minors is required to be in total compliance with safe environment requirements.

Some catechist lists received have included individuals who have not yet completed any diocesan Safe Environment requirements.

The four areas of compliance [a condition of employment or volunteer service] are:

- Have a background check before beginning employment or volunteer service.
- 2) Sign forms A & B of the 2007 diocesan sexual misconduct policy before beginning employment or volunteer service.

- 3) Attend a VIRTUS training session before beginning employment or volunteer service. If there is a serious reason that prevents attendance prior to employment or volunteer service, a grace period of 60 days is allowed, but this only pertains to long term ministries lasting a school or catechetical year.
- 4) Each individual is to complete online training as assigned. Regarding the online training, it is to be completed within 30 days of being posted to the VIRTUS account. Communicate with your volunteers to complete the online training as soon as possible. It takes approximately 10 minutes (or less) to do the training and answer the questions at the end.

Do your Safe Environment training for children and youth during October or the first week of November at the latest. We need to do these at the beginning of the catechetical year rather than later to ensure our children and youth have the tools they need to be safe. Remember we are doing Lessons 1 and 2 this year. These reports are due back to the diocesan Safe Environment Office by November 11, 2014.

The Opt Out form with the information for parents are to be sent to the parents before the children's training. If parents wish to opt out they are to send the opt out form before the lesson takes place and they will then be given the age-appropriate lesson materials for their child(ren).

Remember to use only diocesan forms.
