THOSE WHO CATECHIZE WHAT DOES IT SAY ABOUT WOMEN AND MEN IN CONSECRATED LIFE

The National Directory for Catechesis (NDC) is a great resource for parishes to understand the role of those who catechize: the pastor, the parish catechetical leader (PCL, formerly called the DRE or CRE), the parents, the catechists, and so on.

This month, we will take a look at those who have dedicated their lives to the consecrated life – which

Pope Francis has dedicated this year to. I will take directly out of the NDC what it says about these various people and their role in catechizing to aid catechetical formation as effective in the parish, in the Area Faith Community:

By virtue of their vocation, those in consecrated life catechize by the witness of their consecration and by their apostolic work. Women and men religious offer a public witness to their singular commitment to the mission of the Church in their consecrated life. This witness strengthens the catechetical mission immeasurably. The catechesis offered by consecrated persons come within the context of lives lived with extraordinary dedication to

community life and an uncommon commitment to the Beatitudes. As a result, their catechesis has a distinctive character.

While the Church is blessed with many lay women and men who contribute effectively in the work of catechesis, the contributions of those in consecrated life are unique and cannot be supplied by either priests or laity. Those contributions derive from their profession of the evangelical counsels and the special charisms of their particular communities.

Some religious institutes for men and women were founded for the specific purpose of providing catechetical formation to children, young people, and adults. Throughout the history of the Church, many men and women religious have committed themselves to the catechetical ministry. The history of catechesis in the United States is a chronicle of the critical leadership and dedication of men and women religious in the Church's catechetical mission.

To continue this leadership and dedication, Pope John Paul II has asked that "religious communities dedicate as much as possible of what ability and means they have to the specific work of catechesis. With appropriate training, women and men in consecrated life are particularly suited to serve as parish or diocesan catechetical leaders.

So, with this excerpt from the National Directory of Catechesis, the NDC, we can see how important the roles of those in consecrated life. They offer their witness, their charisms, and their leadership. And they help young people understand the aspect of discernment and discerning one's vocation.

Safe Environment Requirements

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Please remind your catechists and volunteers to complete their online training as soon as possible. We have a significant number who have not completed this. This needs to be a priority to have this done as soon as possible. It takes approximately 10 minutes (or less) to do the training and answer the questions at the end.

Urgent – A high number of volunteers have not yet completed online training which was assigned August 31, 2014. Many of these are catechists.

Any DRE, youth minister, catechist, adults helping with youth ministry, or anyone who may be in a ministry with minors is required to be in total compliance with safe environment requirements.

Some catechist lists received have included individuals who have not yet completed any diocesan Safe Environment requirements. Please double-check with your local SEC to make sure everyone in your programs is fully up-to-date.

The four areas of compliance [a condition of employment or volunteer service] are:

- 1) Have a background check before beginning employment or volunteer service.
- Sign forms A & B of the 2007 diocesan sexual misconduct policy before beginning employment or volunteer service.
- 3) Attend a VIRTUS training session before beginning employment or volunteer service. If there is a serious reason that prevents attendance prior to employment or volunteer service, a grace period of 60 days is allowed, but this only pertains to long term ministries lasting a school or catechetical year.
- Each individual is to complete online training as assigned within 30 days of being posted to the VIRTUS account.

Thank you for your cooperation in fulfilling diocesan requirements to keep our children and youth safe!
