SAFEGUARDING THE DIGNITY OF EVERY HUMAN PERSON

The foundation of Catholic Social Teaching is the Life and Dignity of the Human Person. The United States Bishops call this theme of Catholic Social Teaching foundational because it deals with human beings of all ages, of all cultures, of all races, of all languages, of all abilities. And this theme, as one of the seven themes of Catholic Social Teachings touches all the other themes as well.

And for this year's Catechetical Sunday, it is fitting that "Safeguarding the Dignity of the Human Person," is the theme for this year. In a day and age, where we see on news outlets every day, the disregard and the destruction of human life, we need a theme such this. When we also hear on the news that bullying and cyber-bullying are on the rise, we need a theme such as this to teach children, youth, and adults the importance of safeguarding the dignity of every human person.

As we honor our catechists this year (and catechists include parents, godparents, grandparents, priests, religious, and the countless catechists in our diocese serving children, youth and adults), let us lift up also the people they serve so that they understand this message of safeguarding all human life.

The following are some ideas to honor our catechists in our parishes on Catechetical Sunday, September 20:

- Have a special commissioning prayer for the catechists, acknowledging them during each Mass on that Sunday.
- Have a special coffee and donuts or breakfast in their honor (perhaps have a suggested donation to help fund catechetical formation in the parish)
- Give a special gift to catechists, like the reflection book and/or pin that NCCL has for sale (see how to get these at the end of the article).

Foundations

We will again start Foundations in September 2015. It will be at the new Diocesan Pastoral Center in New Ulm.

Foundations is the diocesan program of basic training in perfective catechesis and theology for paid and volunteer parish staff who are involved in lay ministry.

Potential participants include: volunteer catechists, youth ministers, catechetical leaders of parishes and AFCs, school teachers, small Christian community leaders, head of the domestic churches (moms, dads, guardians), and any personnel (front desk greeters, secretaries, and so on) interested in being a part of the new evangelization.

The group meets one Saturday a month for eight months. The curriculum was developed in cooperation with the Bishop of New Ulm's Office of the New Evangelization and the Office of Adult & Faith Formation. Even better, Bishop LeVoir teaches one of the Saturday sessions.

Parish Visits

The following are some possibilities: an observation of your faith formation during the time of instruction, perhaps an in-service with your catechists, or even a catechetical presentation – guest catechist for adults, youth, or children. Keep in mind that this is not an audit, but a visit to observe and be of service. He will have an assessment tool to benefit your catechetical ministry. ECFL is a structured seven session two -hour class patterned after the highly successful and popular Minnesota ECFE program (Early Childhood Family Education). ECFL consists of a parent-child interaction component, a parent discussion time, and children's learning and play time. This program emphasizes the importance of putting faith at the center of family life at the earliest stages. It is an opportunity to discuss faith education with Catholic parents and an opportunity for parents and preschools to have fun learning more about God together. Religious Education Safe Environment Compliance Reminders

DUE DATES APPROACHING

- If you have not already done so, please send your catechists lists by September 16, 2015. Remember to e-mail in any additional names to Sherry as individuals step forward to volunteer any unfilled needs.
- Send home the Opt-out information to parents the first weeks of class and schedule your Safe Environment training for children and youth for October or no later than November 10, 2015.

Any DRE, youth minister, catechist, adults helping with youth ministry, or anyone who may be in a ministry with minors is required to be in total compliance with safe environment requirements prior to serving.

Please double-check with your local SEC to make sure everyone in your programs is fully up-to-date. Your LSEC should be able to run a parish master list for your convenience as needed. If not, have the LSEC contact the diocesan office. A pending account or "activity watch" grouping are the indications that allow you to know the basic requirements are not yet met.

The LSEC does not need to sort through other columns unless these labels are used to define the status of the user account or the grouping. Complete information is available on the newly launched and updated diocesan Web site.

Annual volunteer training has been posted. You may want to use a catechist training opportunity to have a tablet or two (iPad or other) for all those returning volunteers with your program that have not yet completed the online training. It can be done on the larger screen smart phones quite easily as well. All returning volunteers (anyone trained prior to 8/24) have annual training that is expected to be completed by September 24 or the individual is not in compliance and is not allowed to be unsupervised with minors.

SPEAKING THE LANGUAGE OF THE PEOPLE: MISSIONARIES IN A NEW WORLD

Welcome back! Just for a refresher, in the Youth and Young Adult Ministry section of *Gatherings/Reflections*, we've been learning about Fr. Matteo Ricci and his work in 16th Century China. Remember that the people of China during this time valued intellectual thought and were very skeptical of Christian missionaries. Therefore, the Jesuits decided to take a more subtle approach: act more like "tourists" than like missionaries. They got to know the Chinese people, seeking to understand not only their culture, but also the people themselves. The Chinese began to trust the missionaries and form real relationships. Relationships that led them in the right direction: heaven.

This is the basis of youth ministry: to lead souls to heaven. How do we do that? It's very simple, really: we lead them to Jesus Christ. How do we lead them to Jesus Christ? Step aside and let the Master do his work.

John 3:30

St. John the Baptist had it right when he said, "He must increase, but I must decrease." Here's a man who gained



such a following that people started to think he was the messiah! They listened to him preach. They were baptized by him. They lived as he lived. By all means, the man was popular.

This can happen with our various apostolates with youth: we gain a following. That's discipleship. It's how we evangelize. But if it doesn't lead the ones being discipled to Jesus, it's really just a cult following.

This is the danger of youth groups: they can sometimes lose focus. Even when centered around liturgical celebrations – are youth attracted to the music, to the feeling they get at Mass, or to a great homily? Are they attracted to the relationships they form with friends at youth group, but not particularly interested in forming a lasting relationship with Jesus?

A Fine Line

While all of these things are not bad in and of themselves (in fact, they go hand in hand with having a relationship with Christ), they can easily detract from the purpose of discipleship if we don't keep a close watch on them. There's a fine line between discipleship and just being a tourist trying to make friends in a foreign land. If the Jesuits in China had simply been the wise-men they were esteemed to be and not used that status to lead souls to Christ, they wouldn't have been missionaries. Likewise, if we who lead youth do not ultimately connect them to Jesus and his Church, to what end are we evangelizing?

A Work in Progress

I realize things are getting a little heavy, so let me end on a positive note. Remember that no one is a Saint until they die (I promise it gets more positive). In other words, don't stress over those who come to youth group but are obviously in it for the wrong reasons. Everyone is a work in progress, and that includes the youth we evangelize. The point is that they come seeking something – like the Chinese who entered the home of the Jesuit missionaries – and the most we can do is to present them Jesus Christ. Beyond that, we are not required to do much more.
